Tick Season Survival Guide

Raise Your Hand if You Despise Ticks!



For Dogs & Pets

1. Essential Oil Tick Spray

Mix in a 2 oz spray bottle:

- 10 drops Geranium essential oil
- 10 drops Cedarwood essential oil
- 5 drops Lavender essential oil
- 2 oz distilled water

Spray on your pet's fur before outdoor activities.

2. Apple Cider Vinegar (ACV) Spray

- Mix 1 part ACV + 1 part water
- Spray lightly on your pet before walks.

Add 1 tsp per 50 lbs of body weight to drinking water for internal support.



For Dogs & Pets

3. Diatomaceous Earth (DE)

- Lightly dust food-grade DE onto your pet's fur.
- Avoid inhaling the dust during application.

4. Neem Oil Treatment

- Dilute a few drops of neem oil with coconut oil.
- Apply lightly to your dog's collar or coat.

5. Herbal Tick Collar

- Infuse a fabric collar with Geranium, Cedarwood, or Lavender essential oil.
- Refresh oils every few days.



1. DIY Essential Oil Tick Repellent Spray

Mix in a 4 oz spray bottle:

- 10 drops Geranium oil
- 10 drops Cedarwood oil
- 5 drops Eucalyptus oil
- 2 oz witch hazel or vodka
- 2 oz distilled water Spray on clothing and skin before going outside.



2. Protective Clothing Tips

- Wear light-colored clothing to spot ticks easily.
- Tuck pants into socks to prevent ticks from climbing up.
- Spray shoes, socks, and clothing with tick repellent.

3. Tick Checks

- Always check for ticks after outdoor activities.
- Pay special attention to behind ears, armpits, groin, and hairline.



For Your Yard

1. Cedarwood Mulch

• Use cedar mulch around garden beds and walkways to repel ticks.

2. Diatomaceous Earth (DE)

• Sprinkle food-grade DE in tickprone areas such as pet areas and play spaces.

3. Beneficial Nematodes

- Apply Steinernema carpocapsae nematodes to kill tick larvae naturally.
- Safe for pets and humans.

4. Tick-Repelling Plants

• Plant Lavender, Rosemary, Eucalyptus, Lemongrass, and Garlic in your yard.

5. Natural Tick Control with Birds

• Guinea fowl and chickens eat ticks naturally if allowed to free-range.
