Matthew 6:33 (KJV) But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

In the hustle and bustle of life and business, it's easy to get caught up in the never-ending tasks and responsibilities. We find ourselves constantly busy, striving to accomplish more, yet often neglecting the most important aspect of our lives – our relationship with God. Matthew 6:33 reminds us of the significance of seeking first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. Let us reflect on how we prioritize our pursuit of God and align our lives and businesses accordingly.

Make time for Him each day, whether it's through prayer, reading His Word, worship, or simply sitting in stillness with Him.

No matter what we do, we can always do more...more pressing in, more seeking, more asking, more knocking. Assess: how much do you seek FIRST the kingdom of God and His righteousness on a day to day basis? How can you put Him first more?

Date

Read and meditate on Hebrews 11.

Hebrews 11 is often referred to as the "Hall of Faith" as it highlights the remarkable accounts of men and women who demonstrated extraordinary faith in God throughout history. Reading and meditating on this chapter will inspire and challenge you to examine your own faith, particularly as it relates to your life and business.

As you read through Hebrews 11, consider which account resonates with you the most today. Which story stands out as a powerful example of faith that you can draw inspiration from? Reflect on the challenges and uncertainties you currently face. How can you respond with unwavering faith, just as those mentioned in Hebrews 11 did?

In your business, faith can manifest in various ways. It may involve taking bold steps, even when they seem illogical or risky, because you trust that God is leading you. It could mean persevering through difficult seasons, knowing that God's promises will prevail. 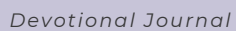

for his steadfast love endures forever!*

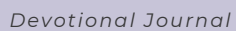

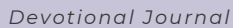

Psalm 27:14 (ESV) Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

Waiting can be so challenging especially if you love to get things done. We often desire immediate results, quick success, and instant breakthroughs. However, the Word of God reminds us of the importance of waiting on the Lord.

To truly grasp the depth of this verse, let's look at the Hebrew meaning of the word "wait". In Hebrew, the word used for "wait" is "qavah," which figuratively means to expect or eagerly look for, as if anticipating something precious. Waiting on the Lord requires us to surrender our desire for control and submit to His divine timing.

It involves letting go of our impatience and trusting that God's timing is perfect, even when it doesn't align with our own expectations.

The waiting process is not meant to be passive or idle. As we wait on the Lord, we are called to be strong and courageous. We are always encouraged to persevere, remain steadfast, and continue taking steps of obedience and diligence in our lives and business endeavors, even when progress seems slow.

How well are you waiting on the Lord in your business journey? Are you trusting and waiting on Him or are you taking matters into your own hands to try to make things happen? Are you waiting with the expectation that something great is going to happen? Read Isaiah 40:31.

Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 and Romans 12:6-8

As followers of Christ, we have been blessed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The gifts of the Spirit are divine enablements given to us by God Himself, empowering us to make a significant impact for His kingdom and yes even within the realm of business. *Psalm 42:11 (ESV) Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me?
Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.*

As business owners, we will encounter seasons when we feel discouraged and downtrodden by the challenges and setbacks we face. The weight of unmet expectations, financial strains, or a lack of progress can cause our spirits to sink into a state of despair.

In moments like these, the words of Psalm 42:11 should echo in our hearts, reminding us to find our hope in God, our ultimate source of strength and salvation.

King David felt down in the dumps, even depressed at times. But he didn't stay in that state and we can't either! He told himself to HOPE IN GOD. We too, must encourage ourselves in the Lord and remind ourselves who we have on our side.

Praise God today! Lift up your voice to Him even when you don't feel like it. That is the type of sacrifice God is looking for from you. Go to Him today and tell Him how you feel. Remember His faithfulness, praise Him in advance, and seek His guidance in your business journey.

Psalm 118:6-7 (ESV) The LORD is on my side; I will not fear. What can man do to me? The LORD is on my side as my helper; I shall look in triumph on those who hate me.

Not everyone we encounter is going to like us. And most of the time the reason people don't like us (even hate us) is because of who we belong to. Jesus said that we would be hated for His name sake. So embrace the hate and love your enemies and yes even in your business dealings. Pray for those who come against you.

Psalm 118:6-7 serves as a powerful reminder of God's presence, protection, and assistance in your journey. With the LORD on your side, fear has no place, and victory is assured. Amen!?

The psalmist asks, "What can man do to me?" Our confidence is not rooted in our own abilities or the opinions and actions of others. Rather, it rests in the sovereignty of God, who holds ultimate authority over all things. Trusting in Him enables us to rise above the fear of human limitations and rest in His unfailing protection.

In what ways have you been fearful of people? What can people do to you? *Romans 8:31* says *What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? And verses 37-39 say No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.* How can you embrace this in your life and business more?

Psalm 37:4 (ESV) Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

Many people think the word 'delight' means to be joyful, but the Hebrew word actually means to be soft or pliable. This sheds a lot more light on what it means to delight yourself in the LORD. Delighting in the Lord means aligning our desires and aspirations with His divine plan, trusting that He knows what is best for us. God is likened to the potter and we are like the clay. If we are soft and pliable (our hearts) He can mold us into a vessel of honor.

But if we are hard, dry , and unmovable then He can't work with us. As we allow Him to shape us, we will receive the desires of our hearts because it will be His will.

Where in your business are you not soft, pliable, and open to the shaping of the Lord? How can your heart become more soft and pliable?

Ephesians 3:20 (ESV) Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us.

How many times have you found yourself imposing limitations on your life and business? We set boundaries based on our own understanding, fears, and insecurities. Yet, the truth is that our God is a limitless God who surpasses all our expectations and surpasses all boundaries.

Newsflash: God is NOT confined by our human limitations or circumstances. When we feel inadequate or face challenges in our businesses, we can take comfort in knowing that God's power is at work within us. He is able to accomplish far more than we can ask or imagine. It is when we surrender to His limitless power that we can experience breakthroughs, innovation, and supernatural growth in our businesses.

Leaving our self imposed limitations requires us to walk by faith and not by sight.

PART 2 Ephesians 3:20 (ESV) Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us.

DREAM bigger. As we acknowledge God's limitless nature, it challenges us to expand our vision. We often limit ourselves by setting small goals or dreaming within the boundaries of what we perceive as achievable. That's actually one of the ways that leaning on our own understanding manifests in our lives. However, when we align our vision with God's plans and purposes, we open ourselves to the extraordinary. God invites us to dream big, to think beyond our own limitations, and to trust Him for the impossible. He longs to stretch our faith and reveal His greatness through our businesses!!

Ask God to expand your vision. Keep asking Him to help you dream bigger, set bigger goals, and do things you never thought possible. Take note of what happens as you ask for this.
